The entire Board of Directors of the Santa Susana Mountain Park Association (SSMPA) wishes to express its strong support for your petition that argues that "Central and Southern California mountain lions comprise an evolutionarily significant unit that should be declared threatened under the state Endangered Species Act."

The SSMPA's mission is to preserve and protect the Simi Hills, Santa Susana Mountains and open space surrounding the Greater Los Angeles region. Our organization was formed in 1971, and since that time we have continually monitored projects within our region, advocating for open space and the wildlife that use it.

As you well know there are Mountain Lions in our Simi Hills. Just last year researchers found four new mountain lion kittens born to P62. In addition many of us emotionally adopted P64, the lion that gained fame for making multiple safe crossings of the 101 and 118 freeways only to succumb to the Woolsey Canyon fire. These animals are our neighbors.

Time is indeed running out for these magnificent animals here in Southern California and the central coast. While the soon to be constructed Liberty Canyon crossing over the 101 will certainly help with genetic diversity, declaring lions "threatened" under the state Endangered Species Act is really their only chance for survival.

On behalf of all of us at the SSMPA and all who live in this region and care for our wildlife, thank you for your advancement of the Petition to List the Southern California/Central Coast Evolutionarily Significant Unit (ESU) of Mountain Lions as Threatened under the California Endangered Species Act (CESA).
