INITIAL PARK PURCHASE IS UNDERWAY !

As a result of many months of hard work over the past three years, land that was once seriously threatened to be subdivided, bulldozed, and destroyed will instead be saved. --

The 265 acre Nichols property will be purchased for what is planned to be the first acquisition of a regional or state park in the Simi Hills and the Santa Susana Mountains.

The acquisition was made possible by the Foundation for the Preservation of the Santa Susana Mountains and the West Los Angeles County Resource Conservation District going into escrow together, the latter group having put up \$40,000 for a specific portion of the acreage.

The Nichols property is a vital link in the mountain park proposal, and is adjacent to both Chatsworth Park North and South. It features a stagecoach trail, numerous rock outcroppings and geologic formations, stands of oak

trees and scenic views galore.



A FEW WORDS ABOUT THE FOUNDATION ...

The specific and primary purposes of the Foundation is the preservation of the Santa Susana Mountains and Simi Hills as open spaces between the rapidly developing Santa Clarita, Simi, and San Fernando Valleys. It will work to protect the plant and animal life, geolog formations and historically significan areas deemed worthy of protecting.

To accomplish the above purposes, the Foundation may buy and hold land and may receive property, bequests and contributions (which are tax deductible

Under the terms of the agreement of the Nichols property purchase, the Foundation will have to come up with \$45,000 as a downpayment one year after the close of escrow.
